Rothschild dynasty said: "Give me control over a nation's economy, and I care not who writes its laws." That statement, likely made in the late 1700s/early 1800s, seems full of sinister intention. U. S. President Garfield observed in 1881, "He who controls the money of a nation controls the nation." In 1933, U. S. Vice President Garner said (referring to international bankers), "You see, gentlemen, who owns the United States." Britain's Chancellor McKenna said in 1924, "I am afraid that the ordinary citizen will not like to be told that the banks CAN and DO create money, and they who control the credit of a nation direct the policy of the governments and hold in the hollow of their hands, the destiny of people." Congressman Charles Lindbergh said in 1920 (before the Great Depression): "Financial panics are scientifically created."

Great Americans like Abraham **Lincoln and Thomas Edison** saw that interest growing on huge national debts could destroy the economy of the nation and the sovereignty of the individuals. Lincoln issued millions of what were called "Abe Lincoln Greenbacks" (dollars). In contrast to government "bonds," they did not call for interest. Edison said that if we could issue a dollar bond, we could issue a dollar bill (note), and the difference is that the bond lets the broker collect twice the amount! When the US government wanted to borrow \$30 million (back in the mid 1800s) for a large project, Edison protested saying, "It is stupid to borrow \$30 million, and have to pay moneylenders \$66 million for the use of the money." Edison was convinced that globalsocialism would be brought about by the creation of debt and interest perpetrated on the nations by the international moneylenders. Both Lincoln and Edison spoke out against the dangers of national debt and compound interest. For over 1,700 years the Western world had forbidden taking of usury (interest). In 901, King Alfred the Great | it...and He can do it if we ask whole-heartedly!

declared, "If any man is found taking usury, his lands will be confiscated, and he will be banished from England." King John said much the same in 1215, and **King James** in 1566 said, "If a man is found taking usury, his lands will be confiscated. It is like taking a man's life, and it must not be tolerated."

More quotes could be given to bring us I understand that the founder of the up-to-date regarding the same idea of world financial control, including the establishing of the U. S. "Federal Reserve Bank," which is not really even American! There is a bigger controlling power than the USA behind it. Mankind becomes merchandise and a mere number to those who plot such control, yet the answer is not anarchy or panic.

God permitted the ancient Hebrews to be taken into captivity repeatedly, due to their persistent refusal to obey, love and serve Him. By loving obedience, they were to have shown the nations what a wonderful God they know and serve. **John Wesley**, the founder of Methodism (1703-1791) was used of God "to spread Scriptural holiness across these lands." But as he drew closer to death, these international bankers were securing their positions to take Britain and other nations into captivity. I believe Wesley's last letter was written to encourage William Wilberforce, Britain's man who did so much to set the slaves free. Historians say that Wesley's work saved England from a revolution like France experienced.

Britain was blessed, but France was bloody. However, if Britain like ancient Israel. chooses to reject and disobey God, then the blessing will turn to curses. Is this what we have been reaping? Remember, *Britain* rejecting God is only accomplished if individuals reject God. "Lip service" religion is not enough to satisfy God or man. What is needed is a full-hearted turning to God—and this CAN be done! The God that opened the Red Sea to free the Hebrew slaves from Egypt can do whatever necessary to free the enslaved souls of Britain, who can then have a tideturning influence on all the nations of the world. 

London stands unique among the world's great international cities. Of course. London is not merely buildings. monuments and parks, and it's chief treasure is not its' banking institutions. People have come here from all over the world, and what is the greatest thing they shall find?

Crowds often came to hear Jesus, and His profound compassion for them is the standard to measure our own kindness and motives. Jesus also went out of His way to help the lonely, isolated individual, for He knew very well that whether it was one or thousands, HE was the help they needed most.

On two occasions, He miraculously fed thousands of people with one person's portion of food. On those occasions He was careful to preserve the left-over food, telling His disciples, "Gather up the fragments (of food), that nothing is lost (wasted)." In view of its national wastefulness, a preacher once said that God would judge America by its rubbish bins! What of London?!

London is full of "fragments." Those fragments are seen in a vast number of ways. Certainly, it is easy to see the fragments of broken homes—a phenomena that is taken as a commonplace— or the fragments of alcoholism, prostitution and drug abuse. But these are not all, by any means. Fragments are found all over London in the high-rise office blocks and in the attractions of the West End. It is so true: "Not all that glitters is gold."

London consists also of fragments of nations. How would Jesus preserve these so that "nothing is lost," as He said? My wife and I are so different in seemingly almost every way. I eat my food with enjoyment, but usually faster than she does. To me, it seems she almost puts the food under a microscope

of analysis in order to appreciate its full taste! What's in this? What's in that?

I have heard generalisations made of some of the world's peoples. Sometimes those observations were basic, and did not consist of mere negative stereotyping.

Even in the Bible, the apostle Paul said "For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom" (1 Cor. 1:22). That little fragment of a sentence could put you off by itself, but if you read the whole chapter, it puts it all in perspective. Paul was speaking about his preaching among the nations, and the description is terrific (see 1 Corinthians chapter 1,2). Paul was familiar with the culture of many different "people groups." He knew well how to approach various people—not that everyone accepted the truth he preached. We must remember that some people even turned away from Jesus Christ, so whose fault is that?!

How would St. Paul sum up people in London today? Verse 30 of the chapter mentioned above (1 Cor.1) may offer a clue to the needs of the nations represented here in London, for after speaking of the Jews and Greeks, he says in contrast, "But of Him (God) are you in Christ Jesus, who of God is made to us wisdom, and righteousness. and sanctification and redemption.

The wisdom of the Greeks degenerated into a proud philosophising of everything while their civilization rested on slave labour. They were wise, but not wise enough to be fair to their fellow man. The Jew wanted righteousness, but it degenerated into the outward, legalistic self-righteous Pharisee. Sanctification basically means "to be set apart." Some other "faiths" make strenuous effort to achieve cleanness and separateness from defilement, yet are only able to produce a PHYSICAL apartness and OUTER sanctification which too often can be a cover for the pride of being different and superior. All the efforts at wisdom, righteousness and sanctification have failed, for they have never received the means of it: Jesus Christ. Verse 30 of 1 Cor. 1 ends with "and redemption." Those are the clue words which expose the failure of the nations. And the failure results in the scattered and wasting Redeemed means "bought fragments. back," so the slave was redeemed when

bought back from slavehood to manhood or womanhood. So the nations went about to establish their own wisdom, righteousness, and sanctification without looking into the face of Christ, and they ended up with a product built on pride which destroyed itself. "Lilies that fester smell worse than weeds." Even "the best" need redemption, and that is where we must start and finish. Because of this, Jesus came to redeem the Pharisee as well as the prostitute. When we look into the face of Jesus, our so-called "good" is seen

in its proper light.
