March 2008 has a magnificent power to bring things together! Well, my wife's birthday will always be on what is called "St. Patrick's Day" (March 17). It once fell on Mother's Day, so I made her a cake with green icing, with white lettering that said: "Happy St. Patrick's Mother's Birthday!" I have a photo to prove it!

This year, however, I noticed with a sense of shock that, in a way, Jews, Muslims and Christians are drawn together this month. Actually, instead of Muslims I should say Iranians, for it is their New Year to which I refer, and that celebration is *Persian* rather than *Islamic.* The Persian New Year falls on Thursday the 20th; the day before "Good Friday," when Christians remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus. However, while Christians are thinking of a rather gruesome event, the Persians are somewhat "joined" by the Jews who celebrate "Purim." Purim commemorates the narrow escape from a Hitlerlike extermination, coincidentally, in ancient Iran—Persia! Purim is on that Friday and Saturday. The various features of the Persian New Year are packed with interesting and meaningful symbolism, which is a study in itself!

As I said, "Good Friday" is a time when many Christians honour that awful event of the Crucifixion. However, *that* **hideous event was one of victory** as well, and I do not refer to any *seeming* "victory" by Christ's enemies! The "forces" that nailed Jesus to the Cross suffered openly humiliating defeat in the very act which they supposed brought them conquest over Christ. A reading of various modern Bible translations of Colossians 2:13-15 will demonstrate what I mean, for they word it quite clearly. Blending some of them together for verse 15, it could read as follows:

"He stripped, disarmed, shook-off and rid Himself of the evil and hostile principalities, powers, princes, rulers and authorities, and boldly made a public example, show and display, and held them up in open contempt as His conquests and trophies, leading them in a victory parade when He celebrated His triumph over them on the Cross!" Unlike Scotland on the front page, this is not an ambition or future goal, it is an accomplished fact...a done deal!

With such a victory parade as this, it is no wonder it sounds like Jewish Purim or Persian New Year! For the Jews, it was rescue, which is just another word for the Christian's word salvation. For the Iranians, it marks the start of new things, new hopes and new possibilities. Because of the Cross and the Christ of the Cross, every person on earth has the opportunity of the greatest "new start" imaginable. The Bible...Old Testament and New...says that without the shedding of blood, sin is not taken away. The entirety of the Bible story of God's rescue of man, makes it clear that the only perfect and God-accepted means by which our sin can be removed is by the bloody death of the Messiah, who God first promised to our first parents: Adam and Eve.

The Big Issue (see page 1) stated that it is now **"an international movement,"** but here we can see that what God accomplished in Jesus Christ is intended for every person on earth. Through the Cross, we may ALL have the greatest rescue ever, and most thrilling new beginning one could hope for!

The main fact remains for both: Jesus WAS born, and He DID die, and DID rise from the dead...for the same reason—to take away our sin. That is a rock-solid foundation, despite all the money-prompted high-jacking by worldly businesses.

Sincere and sensible gift-giving is fine, so long as genuine understanding and observance of the meaning and purpose of those two great dates remain well imprinted on minds and hearts. When we consider those events, there should rise up in all our hearts a sense of genuine and deep thanksgiving, that God would love us so much that He would send the most glorious Recovery Vehicle imaginable to salvage our dented and damaged souls.

It is often a very frustrating experience to try *everything*... including what seems to be "a sure cure"...only to fail. **When love tries its best to help**...only to be rejected or put off to another time in the never-coming future, it is crushing. It is easy for people to say, "Oh, if you do *this* or *that*, the person will understand or get better or change or whatever!" God knows this frustration of His love. Among the many "story-sermons" Jesus told for teaching us priceless lessons was one about two men that died. See this in Luke 16:19, etc. One of these men was rich; the other poor. The poor man went to "heaven," but not simply because he was poor, and that God was finally having some mercy on him. The rich man went to "Hell," and again, not because he was rich. The point I wish to make is that though it was "too late" for the rich man himself to escape the torment of Hell, yet he at least desired that his other brothers, still on earth, would not go to that terrible place. You can see that he should have considered them and himself before. Abraham's reply to the rich man was that his brothers had the writings of Moses and the prophets, and that the brothers could read it, learn from it and escape the same destination of their now-deceased brother. However, the rich man argued that if Abraham would send the poor man back to his brothers, they would believe and change their ways, thereby escaping Hell. Yet, Abraham would not revise his reply, saying very bluntly and sure: "If they do not believe Moses and the prophets, neither would they believe if one rose from the dead!" The application of this truth to Jesus' own resurrection is unquestionable. Jesus was born for us all. He suffered and died for us all. And He rose from the dead for us all. These aspects of His life had been spoken many centuries before His coming to earth (e.g. Acts 26:22,23). But if we refuse to read, to believe and to obey, then we pull the plug on the power of Christ's resurrection as it relates to ourselves personally. In reality, Easter can get as "unplugged" for us as it was for that rich man's brothers. Burning a houseful of £50 notes would not be as wasteful and devaluing as rejecting the Christ of the Resurrection. Let's not unplug Easter, for there is power there for us all! Determine to be plugged in!

EVEN JESUS' DISCIPLES HAD A HARD TIME GETTING "PLUGGED-IN!" Any who really want to find God and know God, will not be busy making excuses for themselves. However, we should be glad that the Bible shows us the disobedience of the Jews and the "thick-headedness" of the disciples. There is hope for you and me!!
