

through all of chapter 53 we see a description of the coming Savior that doesn't *seem* like a good "sales pitch!" 53: 2 - 4 says, "He has no form or comeliness: and when we see Him. there is no beauty that we should desire Him. He is despised and rejected by men, a Man of sorrows and acquainted 5 came to her senses. She ran out in with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our danger to any who fail to respond sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, quickly to the voice of God and the smitten by God, and afflicted.

Such a description doesn't seem to match the one I will now share from Song of Solomon 5. The "beloved" had come to the door of his "sister... spouse...love...dove...undefiled" and urged her to open for him to enter. In a species of madness, the lady made excuses, such as her having got ready for bed, had washed her feet and didn't strongly declared her lovesickness for want to get them dirty and had put on loads of perfume! She excused herself, although her heart yearned in love for beloved is greater than any other. After the one who stood just outside the door, a love-filled poetic description of the calling for her to let him in.

That doesn't sound possible, yet it has been being repeated, world-wide, times beloved, and this is my friend"! (5:16). without number, through the rolling I believe there are untold numbers of Christ knocking at the door, which is reaction take place here in London!

taken from Rev. 3:20. It is called The Light of the World. As one song says:

"He stood at my heart's door mid sunshine and rain. And patiently waited an entrance to gain. What shame that so long He entreated in vain, For He is so precious to me!"

Finally, the lady in Song of Solomon search for her beloved, but failed to find him, for he had gone away. She called out to him, but got no reply. This is a warm and loving call of His Spirit.

We see this same lady going through the streets asking people if they had seen him. They mocked and assaulted her, and rudely removed her veil to make her appear immodest and a disgrace to society. One old song asks, "Is this vile world a friend to grace, to help us on to God?" Of course not. Yet, the lady her missing beloved. The people then asked the lady why she thinks her human treasure she adored, she said "Yes, he is altogether lovely. This is my

It happens today in London. description of her beloved friend, caused the citizens then to ask, "Where has people who, for whatever reasons, refuse your beloved gone, that we may seek to open the door to Jesus Christ. another who had terrible burns from a rope being pulled through his hands. His sympathy, though genuine, was not from experience. Sometime later, the sympathetic man had an energetic calf (young cow) pull a rope similarly through his own hands, leaving painful burns across them. God sympathised with man's pains and even death, but in Jesus Christ, He experienced it!

Jesus personally brings the needs of all true believers to God the Father. having ascended after His death and resurrection\*. He does this, having experienced not only *death* like us, but also life and its difficulties, as well! This is what Heb. 4:14-16 says: "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God. let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need."

A young Japanese student once asked me why Buddha seemed so happy and Jesus so sad. In her mind, she saw a bulging, beaming Buddha contrasted to a cursed and crucified Christ. I replied, again from Hebrews, but chapter 12:1-3 where it blends the two seeminglyopposing emotions into one. It shows both of these possessing the heart, mind and will of our Saviour, as it again urges us: "Therefore we also, since we are Son, but delivered Him up for us all" surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us. and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame,

and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls."

We should express the greatest Thanksgiving that Christ's joy to rescue us from sin and hell caused Him to **gladly** face the pain and shame of the Cross. Neither Christ nor the Father had a pleasure in torture and death. It was the immeasurable and inconceivable love for lost, sinful and hell-bound humanity that caused God to give His Son. AND for Christ to willingly go to the Cross.

gift! (2 Cor. 9:15).

The article ending at the bottom of the page at the left ends with a contrast of the sacrifices of two sons. One belonged to Abraham; the other was God's. Abraham's son, Isaac, was spared by an angel sent from God. Yet, by direct. Divine action. Christ was not spared. Jesus' cousin, John the Baptist, announced that Jesus was "the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world" (Jn. 1:29). However, John's announcement was long-before preceded by the eternal appointment of God, for Christ was "the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world"! (Rev. 13:8).

Reading the life of Christ as seen in the Bible, we see the unparalleled glory of God displayed in His words and works in this world. Heb. 1: 1-3 bursts out all boundaries and perimeter fences, so to speak, and gives the fuller view of Christ's "CV," which is such as no one else has or can ever equal or surpass.

During His brief earthly ministry of three years, Jesus faced the most dreadful... the most pitiful... I could say, the most stupid resistance and opposition, even prior to the Crucifixion. My recent reading of the period approaching the Cross renewed my exposure to this horrific...and willful... ignorance. They just refused to stop resisting their own rescue! It is only matched by today.

The front-page article tries to show why we should all offer **Thanksgiving** to

God, both in *words* and *living*. This is based upon the fact of His priceless and precious Gift of Salvation. That Gift comes through the one and only means He Himself supplied: Jesus Christ, His long-promised Messiah-Savior.

This Gift is *timeless* and *global* in its application. It applied, "by faith," before, as well as after Christ came, was crucified and rose again. "Salvation by faith in Christ alone" is not a mere "religion," nor an invention of Jews, Europeans or Americans in order to con people. From the time of Adam to the time Christ came to earth. man was saved and accepted by God strictly by repentance and faith, and all that flows from those two elements (such as obedience). Heb. 6: 9 calls them "things that accompany salvation."

So what makes this salvation so unique and great? In the previous issue of our little paper, the front-page article was titled "IESUS' WIFE." A young lady passed by me last month at King's Cross, took a paper, and while walking away, turned and said with a smile: "I am Jesus" wife!" If she is walking with the Lord HIS Way, she is correct...but not merely because she is a *born*-female (as wives are to be in *earthly* marriages).

The uniqueness, and singular greatness of Christ and the salvation from sin He brings is illustrated in part by "husband-wife" relationship as seen in the Bible. A classic example is seen in that literal love story in which God also shows how the relationship is supposed to be between man and the Savior God gave to man. I refer to the Bible "Book" called variously Song of Songs or Song of Solomon or Canticles.

Space does not permit great detail, so I will focus on a specific incident in that Book. Before sharing this "incident," I will admit what may *appear* to be a great contradiction! In the God-inspired words of the prophet, Isaiah, in 52:13
