the mirror. I am illustrating Jesus. "the Lion of the tribe of Judah." But my "Jesus lion" sees more than Himself in the mirror! Imagine a wedding day, with a bride looking in the mirror, eagerly waiting to be joined to her groom; her husband; her forever mate. Now imagine Christ, "the Lion of Judah" seeing His bride: not Himself! This time the *Groom* is looking in the mirror! The *bride* is not in that page 3 clipart picture, but HE sees her, anyway!

We are meant to see Christ, "the Lion!" HE sees us, "But we see Jesus!" As we gaze into that mirror, we are not to focus on ourselves. but on Christ. "Self," "The Big I," is to be out of the picture!

Yet, writing to people who had not seen Jesus, physically, St. Peter says "Whom having not seen, you love; in whom, though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory" (1 Peter 1:8).

Remember. 2 Corinthians 3 and 4 compare Moses' fading glow to Jesus' never fading glory. It says that as we gaze into the God-given mirror, we can be increasingly changed into Christ's own image by God's Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 3:18), "more and more unto the perfect

Jesus is "the Lion of the tribe of Judah," but He is also "the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world." (John 1:29, 36; Isaiah 53:7; Acts 8:32). He is the Lamb that sacrificed Himself \overline{FOR} our sin. But Christ is also "the Lion of the tribe of Judah," strong to deliver each of us **FROM** our sin.

One day, all coverings, veils and masks will be taken off. For Christ's "Bride," that will be a Grand Day! Revelation 19:7 tells us why: "Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready." Have you made yourself ready? Go and gaze into God's mirror and He will show you... but we cannot really and truly look in that mirror with a mask on. One day, all masks will come off. It is best to take them off right now!

WHAT A MASK!



"MAN OF A THOUSAND FACES"

THAT is what they called Lon Chaney Sr.; the "Phantom" on page 1. A 1957 movie about him had the above title, for Chaney was said to have "a thousand faces."

Chaney's "make-up" box was simple, yet it helped to transform him in "a thousand" ways. Sin "in the human heart" is also simple, yet it grows, deepens its roots and sends out many shoots. It becomes the substitute for the actual person God wants us to be. Sin would disable humans from being or even desiring to be the person that Jesus Christ died to help us to become.

Upon his **death**, Lon Chaney's career passed on to his son. Yet, far worse, upon Adam's **"deathbed"** fall into sin in Eden, he passed his *sin-corrupted* nature on to the entire human family! (Genesis 2:17; Romans 5:12; 6:23; James1:14,15).

A MASK AND A MIRROR



A LION AND A LOOKING GLASS

There are about 200 names and titles for Jesus Christ in the Bible. In Revelation 5:5 Jesus is called "the Lion of the tribe of Judah." There's the Lion! So, what does the Lion, above, see in the mirror?

In the Bible, 2 Corinthians 3 and 4 contrast the shining face of Moses with the face of Jesus. It says: 1) The shine on Moses' face faded away until he met with God again, 2) Jesus Christ never lost the brilliant grace and glory of God, for He was God living right among us.

Those two chapters *also* say that we can be changed into the very image of Christ, "from glory to glory, by the Holy Spirit of God!" But it says we must focus in that "mirror" with no mask; no hiding anything! (2 Corinthians 3:18).

Pulling the mask off shows the ugliness of sin like the face of the Phantom of the Opera. NO! worse than the Phantom! The Phantom's face was fake; a performance, but human sin is real. Sin is dreadful, destructive and damning. It is truly the world's worst plague. Yet, God has done something about it! Let's

look in His mirror and be changed.

Our bathroom mirror has two sides; one is normal; the other is magnified. The Bible speaks of **two matchless mirrors** in which we may rightly see God and see ourselves.

of <u>liberty</u>" and is like a mirror. (James 1: 21-25). God's <u>law</u> and our human <u>liberty</u> do not need to be in conflict. However, as James says, we can look in a mirror, then walk away and forget to correct something we saw! I've done that! Let's gaze into *God's* mirror and correct everything He shows us. (Phil. 2:12, 13; 1 Jn. 1:7; 2 Pet. 1:5-11; Gen. 20:3-6).

One the most important names for Christ in the Bible is "THE WORD." Words communicate ideas and much more, from person to person. God speaks, and His greatest speaking to us was by Jesus Christ. (Hebrews 1: 1-3; John.1:1, 2).

In Christ, God not only <u>talked</u>, but also <u>walked</u> among us: "And **THE WORD** was made flesh and lived for a while among us, and we saw His glory; the glory as of the only born of the Father, full of grace and truth." (John [the Gospel] 1:1-14; 14: 7-9). What a Mirror to gaze into! "THE WORD" didn't become words, words and more words. "The Word became <u>flesh!</u>" (also <u>First John</u> 1: 1-4).

Gaze into both of those mirrors:

1) the Bible and 2) the Christ of the Bible. Certain Greeks came to Christ's disciples and said, "Sirs, we desire to see Jesus!" (John 12: 21). Hebrews 2: 9 says "But we see Jesus!" HE is the One we need to see!
